From the Garden Guru

Hi everyone. April is the time to grow primulas, pansies, and Iceland poppy for winter flowering. Lift and divide bearded iris. Plant hyacinth and tulips in pots so that they can be brought indoors and enjoyed in spring. I just love daffodils the more the merrier, I must have over three thousand in my garden and will be planting more from the Aussie Bulb Company shortly. It's time to cut back Cannas; be cruel. Plant new lemon trees now; use sulphate of potash around drip line. Dig compost into vegie beds. Cymbidium orchids feed with a high potassium fertiliser. Lift dahlia corms and store in dry place. Plant aquilegia; not only lovely flowers but exquisite foliage, Californian tree poppy, Canterbury Bell, carnation, hollyhock, larkspur, lupin,

nasturtium, oriental poppy, pansy and stock. Fuchsias: prune as flowers finish to encourage new blooms. Fertilise lawns when it's raining. Pull out and destroy old tomato plants. Vegetables: plant broad beans, beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, lettuce, onion, parsnip, radish, silver best, spinach and turnip. What's new: the deep pink of the David Austin rose Sir John Betjeman just gets deeper as the blooms open, an arching bush rose, it's perfect for borders against softer colours. See you soon Wally.
