From the Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's October already and time to plant summer flowering plants. Mulch to enrich your soil, prune wisteria after flowering. Aerate and fertilise lawns, pick roses for indoor display. Grow Hydrangeas from cuttings, put a little iron chelate in soil this will make flowers blue. Control slugs and snails.

Top ten jobs to do this month: Divide established rhubarb crowns and create new plants. Cut back perennials that have died down. Divide herbaceous perennials. Move tender plants including aquatic ones into a greenhouse or conservatory. Plant out spring cabbages. Harvest apples, pears, grapes and nuts. Prune climbing roses, also prune camellias after flowering. Hope to see you soon on the bowling green, Wally.
