Hi everyone, it's November and warming up at last; great time to plant asparagus, plant on mounds for best results. Seeds of climbing beans, carrots, broccoli, cabbage and capsicum can be planted now for harvest in late summer. Tulips should have died down by now, so lift and store in dark dry place ready for planting out next June. Fertilise lawns now we are getting some showers saves you watering in. I am in the process of cutting all daffodil and lillium leaves off as they look so untidy leave four inches from ground. When planting out annuals e.g. aster, ageratum, brachicome, campanula, delphinium, lobelia,
