The Garden Guru

Here we are in December and weather is changeable at best. Still time to sow vegie seeds though i.e. climbing beans, runner beans, beetroot, carrots, chilli peppers, squash, cucumber, mustard greens, parsley, pumpkin, sweetcorn and turnip. You can buy packets of mixed annual seed; there are about ten different varieties in each one; would look great in pots. I have just planted out several pots with these seed mixtures. My notes say to prune fuschias now but mine are in full bloom at the moment, so I suggest you leave it till January. It

will warm up soon I hope, so don't forget to water all your pot plants, easy to forget with your minds on Christmas. Remove bottom leaves from tomato plants; this will reduce disease from water splash and make plants stronger. Hope you all have a great Christmas and I will see you on the bowling green. Wally.
