#### Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's May again and all the leaves are dropping. Don't waste them, gather as many up as you can and mulch them when dry with your Ozito vacuum blower and mulcher from Bunnings only \$63 a bargain, only trouble is they are electric not battery. When preparing your next vegetable or flower patch sprinkle liberally with leaves and dig in, come spring you will have lovely friable soil. Primulas self seed everywhere so dig them up when ground is wet and pot up for Spring. Plant vegie seeds now:brussel sprouts, cabbage, broad beans, carrots, garlic, early onion, rhubarb, shallots and snow peas. Planting in Autumn gives plants time to establish a good root system, so they are not as reliant on water in the warmer months and are not so vulnerable to any scorching days or long dry spells we may encounter. Planting now means that by the time spring arrives your garden will be bursting at the seams with healthy plants and stunning blooms. Crop rotation is important so you do not get deformed vegies. Simple rule:- root vegetables followed by flowers and finish with above ground vegies. Rotate every three years. That's all for now see you on the bowling green Wally.
