Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's June and damned cold but it's a great time to plant herbs eg chamomile and lemon grass. You could give mint and lemon balm a go as well but be careful to contain them as they can take over. Why not try lovely flowering stuff such as cornflower, calendula, dianthus, pansies, viola, snapdragons, stock, ageratum and marigolds. They are great at attracting pollinators and I reckon look tops as well. Bare rooted fruit trees and deciduous ones will be in your local nursery now, don't forget to

prune them back before planting them out. Remember stone fruit trees may take a few years to produce, so be patient. Top up mulch in your veggie patches. Don't put too close to stems as they will rot off, mulch after watering to about 7cm. Plants need a feed this time of year especially seedlings, apply early in the morning. If frost is forecast overnight protect tender plants with temporary overnight cover. Plant liliums for a summer display. Always check for snails especially after rainfall. Start planting early varieties of strawberries. Plant asparagus, rhubarb and broad beans. Happy gardening, see you on the bowling green! Wally.



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
