Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's July and we are half way through winter, thank the lord. Why not head out to the garden shed and sharpen, clean, oil and maintain your garden tools. Sounds tedious but it's really rewarding and will save cash in the long run. Time to give roses a good prune, don't be shy give them a good hammering as they will benefit from it in Summer. It is also time to plant out bare rooted rose bushes. Top up mulch on your veggie patches, use sustainable low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down. Also prune deciduous fruit trees, give them a good haircut, all but apricot. There is not much doing in the veggie plot at the moment, but you could try lettuce particularly with the price it is at the moment, also celery, broad beans, Jerusalem artichokes (put them in a pot or they can take over), garlic radish and spinach. Bulbs:- Plant gladioli, hippeastrum, day lily, canna and vallota. Flowers:- Plant alyssum, calendula, candytuft, carnation, campanula, delphinium, dianthus, foxglove, hollyhock, larkspur, lobelia, marigold, pansy, penstemon, petunia, phlox, poppy, primula, salvia, snapdragon, stock, verbena and viola. Perennials:- To increase stocks lift and divide Achillea, coreopsis, hellebores. heuchera. penstemons and chrysanthemums. Protect tender pot plants from frost. Great time to plant asparagus crowns mound them up for best results. That's all folks see you on the bowling green Wally
