

Things are starting to pick up again with the slight improvement in the weather, mind you it is still a bit BC but at least it does not seem to be raining as much.



### Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's been a long and wet winter, but Spring is here at last. Hooray! Prepare your garden for Spring planting by improving your soil. Lightly dig it over, popping in plenty of organic matter including top notch compost and well-rotted manure. Don't forget to mulch

the beds with straw mulch. This bed will be awesome come planting time.

Why not try some lovely colour in your patch like nasturtium, snapdragons, phlox, petunia, marigolds (french), and celosia. They are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects, to your front and back garden, They look fantastic as well.

Now is the time to plant sun-flower seeds. Find a sunny spot where you would like to see some happy sunflowers later in the year and plant the seeds double the depth of the seed, cover lightly with soil and wait, they'll be popping their heads up in no time.

Check for citrus gall wasp and remove affected sections by pruning well below the gall. Shape and remove dead wood. Don't get overexcited it's too early for tomatoes. Plant after Melbourne Cup Day that's ideal. Your flower and veggie garden should have 6-8cm of mulch on them to stop weeds. Prune natives after flowering, Time to plant passion fruit and make sure to fertilise well.

Vegetables:- Plant broad beans, cabbage, carrots, celery, Chinese cabbage, endive, kohirabi, lettuce, parsley, parsnip, pea, potato, radish, silverbeet, spring onion and turnip. That's all for now. Happy gardening and see you on the bowling green. Wally
