Message From the Coach

The voting system we will be working to is the same as the Brownlow Medal Voting.

3 Votes for the player you believed was the best in the rink from the other 3 players.

2 Votes for the second-best bowler

And lastly 1 vote for the bowler that was below the other 2 players. This does not mean that a bowler did not bowl well, it simply means the

other bowlers were slightly better. Please use the comments section to clarify. You can write on the back of the card at the halfway mark if that helps you.

However, we do not want to see 2 separate scores. This is a very simple voting system so PLEASE stop making it more difficult than it is. No .5 votes, no 2,2,2 votes.

The bowler with the most votes in each side will be deemed the Greenlow Medal Winner of that side. All voting cards that are not submitted or compliant will not be counted, therefore you will be costing the bowlers in your rink an opportunity to win this converted award.

Fantastic to see so many bowlers in Mooroolbark shirts at the club the past 2 Saturdays with some great results. The disappointing thing for me is the size of some of the losses we are incurring which

some of the losses we are incurring which makes it impossible for the other rinks to carry. Remember we are a team of 16, individual wins mean nothing without the overall result falling our way. A total scorecard should fall between 35 & 40 shots. More if it's in our favour. Basically, we need to minimise our shots against and attempt to keep them under 3 per end.

It is hard to believe another month has gone by. With the challenging weather the gardens have been well watered and the continual weeding challenge has not been too bad. Lots of tidying up and general mulching and with the slight warming up of the temperature, I think the gardens are looking really good.

It would be greatly appreciated if we could get a bit of help with the grass cutting, as last week Bruce had to do all of the mowing by himself, due to young Vic being unavailable. With the help of Peter Orger, we are trialling poly carbonate roofing on one of the shelters at the north end of the first green. This could take a bit of time as there is quite a lot of work in making and fitting the required frames for the roofing.

Garden Guru

Hi everyone, citrus is a must for every garden, arriving in Australia with the First Fleet, where they settled into almost every back yard in suburban Australia, to say nothing of our huge commercial plantings. Brilliant green, glossy foliage can be enjoyed all the year round, the pristine white flowers are not only beautiful, but fragrant and the fruit hang like glowing lanterns from the branches. How can any garden be without this treat. My personal favourite is the Mever which is like a cross between an orange and a lemon. Most citrus can cope with a mild frost, with the best types for Melbourne gardens being lemon, kumquats, mandarin and oranges plus the cold hardy Rangpur lime. However cold will enhance the beautiful red pigments in blood oranges. Dahlia tubers can be planted now. 'Moor Place' is an exquisite dark burgundy button pom pom dahlia that produces a mass of glorious blooms all season. Dark balls emerge from almost black buds. Pick when almost fully open to enjoy in a vase indoors. Also 'Neon Rose' has

dark foliage and pink flowers. Now that daffodils have finished flowering, bend the leaves over on two or three of the plants and tie with string. Resist the urge to cut them off as this will feed the bulbs for next year's display. Liquid fertilise your gardenias to revive them after winter slumber. Check roses for black spot and spray if required. Veggie patch:- Plant flowers such as french marigolds, nasturtium and calendula to encourage bees to aid pollination. That's all for now see you on the bowling green! Wally
