

From The Board Hello Members

As you would expect the main focus of the Board for the last few weeks has been the effects of the rain storm which happened on 25th October. For those that don't know the three greens and the work shops were inundated with rain water run off that came from the Kiloran Reserve.

The current situation is:

- Grass Greens They were both flooded, but thanks to the green keeper and Club volunteers, were cleaned up and made ready for pennant in a couple of days,
- Synthetic Green Was badly affected by the storm water. A damage report was obtained from a green's installation contractor. They are recommending that it be replaced. Some recovery work has been done by our green keeper and Club volunteers and a section can now be used for social bowls. Further maintenance work to be done to see what can be achieved for social, barefoot and pennant bowls. Further



investigation required regarding long term options.

- Work Shops and Tank Room Both were flooded and needed a good clean up but no apparent damage to the building. All machinery being checked for damage,
- Insurance An assessor from our insurance broker has inspected the site and we await their report.
- Grants Some minor grants are on offer from the State Government and Bowls Victoria for which we will submit an application.
- Yarra Ranges Council- As the bulk of the storm water came from Kiloran Park (Council land) we have arranged a meeting with the Council to discuss the situation. We will keep updating as the situation progresses.
- We are pleased to announce that Julie Burton has taken on the role as Sunshine Lady. So please let her know of any member's welfare issues or

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significant events (anniversary, birthdays etc).

• Planning for the End of Year break up continues and will be on the 17th December. Details to be announced in the near future.

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Garden Guru

Hi everyone, I was talking about citrus last month. Just remember they are very hungry plants and must be fed once a month with a citrus fertilizer. New varieties are Yuzu,

Variegated Calamondin (the fruit is perfect for preserves and marmalade) and Clementine (Nules) a cross between a mandarin and sweet orange. Arnold blood orange is an excellent small tree for most gardens. We are always being told to eat more fruit and vegetables and get more exercise. Get out into your garden for your daily workout, it's good for your health. Think about all the weeding, digging, mulching, planting and raking you can do in your garden, wow what a workout, not only that your garden is a great moral booster so it's good for your mental health as well. Time to plant some home grown vitamin power houses:- capsicum, chilli, beetroot, carrots, cucumber. eggplant, lettuce, potatoes, pumpkin, leeks, silverbeet, squash, sweetcorn and zucchini. Your tomatoes should be in the ground now, plant half way up the stem after taking lower leaves off, water in well and surround each plant with sugar cane mulch to stop drying out. Annuals:- liquid fertilise and dead head Azaleas. If lace bug is present, treat by burying Confidor tablets around plants. alyssum. Flowers:plant ageratum, dahlia, helichrysum, amarenthus, aster. nasturtium, pansy, petunia, phlox, snapdragon and sunflower. Wally
