Garden Guru

Hi everyone! A new year is with us and the weather is terrific! Still time to sow summer beans, beetroot, corn, eggplant, radish, carrots, parsnips and other root crops, cherry tomatoes and mini capsicums. Also winter brassicas, with a little extra watering and shade. Lettuce too, can be planted until the tail end of January but may benefit from protection under shade cloth. Planting now means you will have more crops to harvest through Autumn and Winter. In the flower garden, there is still time to sow Californian poppy, gypsophila, everlasting daisy, pansy, primula stock and sweet pea. Dead head annuals and fertilise fortnightly. Nerines and crocus can be planted now for an Autumn display. Cut back climbers after flowering, as well as hydrangeas. Dead head roses and water frequently, feed tomatoes with tomato specific fertilizer and water regularly. Enjoy the sunshine and I will see you on the bowling green! Wally
