### Garden Guru

Hi everyone, have you tried growing sweet peas that add vibrant colour to your garden? Scented varieties are out now. Try pale blue Flora Norton, white Highscent, purple blue Lord Nelson and the delicate cerise pink Miss Willmott.

Bulbs:- plant anemone, daffodil, freesia, grape hyacinth, jonquil, lachenalia, sparaxis and tritonia. Tulip bulbs should be placed in

crisper for 4-6weeks before planting so now is the time. A new tulip out is the double fringed 'Queensland'. It is red and white for United. Start potting up primulas if you have grown them before, as they will have self- seeded everywhere, so dig them up. Also pot up pansies, violas and Iceland poppies for winter flowering. Fertilise Camelias and fertilise and spray citrus trees with white oil. I have been told Queensland fruit fly is rife in Melbourne so watch out for them. Use Autumn leaves for the compost heap.

Flowers:-sow seeds of alyssum, carnation, cornflower, Canterbury bell, delphinium, hollyhock, lupin, stocks and verbena.

Vegetables:- beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, leek, lettuce, onion, parsnip, radish and silverbeet. I came back from holiday and found two truss tomatoes too soft to eat so I will keep the seeds and let you know if they germinate. That's all for now see you on the bowling green Wally.
