Garden Guru

Hi everyone. Famously known as Dame Edna's favourite bloom, the gladiola has recently seen a resurgence in gardens around the world, where the tall flower spikes bring drama and excitement to the landscape in early Summer. They thrive in all parts of Australia. It is best planted in early Spring producing stunning flowers in late Spring and Summer. They are available in a rainbow of colours and are related to Iris, working well in cottage gardens. Easy to grow, plant and forget about them until mid to late Spring. Water regularly when shoots appear, best grown in full sun but will tolerate some afternoon shade, they look great in a vase too. Now is the time to fertilize your camelias and when flowers are finished tidy the plant with a little prune. Flowers:-Plant ageratum, aster, begonia, celosia clematis, cineraria (my favourite), cleome, dahlia, mimulus, oriental poppy, petunia, phlox, portulaca, statice, sunflower, and

verbena. Plant flowers such as french marigolds and nasturtium in your vegie patch to encourage bees to aid pollination. That's all for now see you on the bowling green. Wally.
