Garden Guru

Hi everyone, it's time to plant tomatoes, choose a sunny spot with well-drained soil. Tomatoes are heavy feeders, so make sure to prepare your soil by adding lots of potassium, rock dust, potash and blood and bone. You can also plant other summer vegies too, such as chilli, capsicum, cucumber, pumpkin, zucchini, eggplant and corn. Interplant these with some beneficial attracting plants like alyssum, marigold, dill, and parsley to keep aphids, white fly and other pests under control. Dragon fruit or Pitaya is a perennial climbing tropical cactus that produces vibrant juicy fruit, cuttings can be planted this month, start them in small pots until roots have formed and there's healthy new growth, then transfer them to a large pot or the garden, They grow very tall so you will have to stake them. Liquid fertilize annuals and dead head. Sow cosmos seed or plant seedlings for a massed summer display. Remember to start mulching around fruit trees and plants to retain moisture in the soil and prepare trees for netting next month. That's all for now, see you on the bowling green Wally.
