Garden Guru

Hi everyone, a healthy soil packed with nutrients is a basic requirement for plants to thrive, unfortunately not all gardens are blessed with natural fertile soil. Growing a green manure or adding a layer of compost or aged animal manure will probably be all you need, but if your plants are showing signs of deficiencies such as poor growth, discoloured leaves, leaf drop or low yields it's certainly worth trying a fertiliser.

Nitrogen:-stimulates foliage growth on leafy greens. Potassium:-promotes flower formation essential for crops like tomatoes and peppers. Phosphorus:-is good for all round plant growth and vigour, good for root vegetables, but harmful to Australian natives, if used excessively. Add fertiliser to your soil at start of growing season. For flowering bulbs fertilize once the flower has faded but greenery remains it will help the bulbs replenish their nutrients for next year. That's all for now, have a merry and safe Christmas, I'll see you on the bowling green Wally.
