## Garden Guru - Wally

February is the perfect time to plant for the cooler months ahead. As well as veggies, try seed garlic and include some vibrant flower seeds and bulbs. The last official month of Summer usually signifies a change of focus with Autumn crops replacing summer cropping plants as they finish fruiting. The unusual weather patterns of this Summer have gardeners guessing, but with well- prepared soils, mulch and vigilance against weeds and pests, we can still reap a ripping harvest. Start Autumn crops in punnets mid-month for planting out in March. Include 'cut and come again' herbs and leafy greens and get those carrots in now so they will be crisp and tender towards the end of Autumn. Supplementary watering remains critical during dry spells and pest management is essential. Spray azaleas if lace bug (rusty brown colouring underneath and silver on top) is present. Watch out for powdery mildew on zucchinis, pumpkin and cucumbers and if present, spray with a lime sulphur product. Plant alyssum, carnation, cineraria, cyclamen, delphinium, hollyhock, larkspur, lobelia, nemesia, pansy, petunia, snapdragon, sweet pea and verbena.
