Here is Gerry's first tip - Practice, Practice and more Practice. He has great step saving measures as well. First question?

Are all the bowling greens the same size and width? - NO!

Can't get up? - Could be rink length. The Minimum is 32 Metres and the Max is 40 Metres. The rink width can also vary between 3.8 and 5.4 metres. So, if you take your line from rink markers be careful, because of varying widths.

Also, Frank Hargreaves has advised that he will be setting up bowls drills soon.

SELF MANAGED PRACTICE DRILLS RECORD YOUR OWN SUCCESSES AND CHALLENGES

• The Caterpillar - Play a first bowl – then follow to add 30cms with each bowl. Start short so you don't have to walk too far, to start again.

• The 24 Bowl test – record your results with 4 bowls each distance – 21m = Backhand x 4 then return with Forehand. Repeat on 30m then again on 35m. (This can be seen on the next page).



Monday Morning Crew

Minimal garden work at this time of the year, but there have been a few things going on to keep us busy. We have removed Ivy and Blackberry from outside of the Southern fence, as it has been growing through and onto the grass along the south side of Green 3. We physically removed it as it was not desirable to spray with poison. We also repaired a burst water pipe in front of the Maintenance shed. It was a good thing we were there at the time, as it would have drained the big water tanks, wasted a lot of water and potentially damaged the pump.

We removed the broken plastic drainage box at the bottom of the ramp from the container as it has been a tripping hazard. This will be replaced with a concrete box in the next couple of weeks, so keep an eye out for the orange cone. The seats around the greens are being repaired and painted, ready for Pennant as well as painting of the rink markers.

I will be going away from July 9 and returning at the end of October. During this period, Dave Arnott will be the one to take the blame for anything that goes wrong around the place. Garden Guru Hi everyone, it is June and the weather is great at the moment to plant Brassicas. Did you know Brassicas came from wild cabbage, which at first glance appears like a pretty uninteresting plant with large thick leaves and hefty stalks? A native of Europe, it grows in limestone cliffs. It is neither gorgeous nor tasty. If it sprung up in your garden, you would think it was a weed. But several thousand years ago, some clever and creative humans unleashed an unthinkable amount of delicious diversity from this humble plant, changing human history and menus forever.

Though you may not have known, you've eaten wild cabbage before, calling it Broccoli, Kale, Cauliflower, Brussel Sprouts, Red Cabbage or Savoy. All of these, as well as 332 registered Brassica varieties were devised from Wild Cabbage. Cannas:- dig up and divide to produce new plants. Flowers:- Plant Alyssum, Calandula, Candy Tuft, Canterbury Bells, Nigela, Pansy,

Penstemon, Poppy, Primula, Snapdragon and Viola. Plant Lilliums for a Summer display. Also, early varieties of Strawberries. Vegetables:- Plant Asparagus, Rhubarb and Broad Beans, (dig in after harvesting to enrich soil). That's all for now. See you on the bowling green. Wally
