### THE BLIND FACTORY



#### Garden Guru

Hi everyone,

February offers the perfect opportunity to plan for a thriving Autumn in your garden. It's all about keeping your summer garden productive while setting the stage for the next season of growth.

Take time to enjoy harvesting tomatoes, zucchinis, cucumbers and beans at their peak. Regular picking not only ensures the best flavours but also encourages plants to keep producing.

While the summer heat lingers on, it's important to water deeply in the early morning or dusk to minimise evaporation.

Now is the time to plan your cool season veggie garden. Start seeds for broccoli, brussel sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower and kale, or prepare your soil for direct planning later this month.

Also, start planning where to plant bulbs e.g. daffodils, tulips and hyacinths at the end of the month. Watch out for powdery mildew on zucchinis, pumpkin and cucumbers. If present, spray with a lime sulphur product.
